

Rides Begin in October

In June we'll be posting the run sheet sign-up for public rides in the club house. They start on Sunday, October 7th. We really need volunteers to have 3 train crews, station master, greeter and gift shop. We really can't depend on the same 6 or 8 members that are at the club every Sunday. If we can't get the list filled in by August we'll have to discuss what our options are without enough volunteers. Do we stop public rides? Reduce Crews? Go to one Sunday per month? It is up to our members.

We have found large gaps in the loco log books where the locos, both club use and public run use only, are showing hours on the engine meter but no logs to match. We have also found damage done to the equipment when we pull a loco out for Sunday run that wasn't there when we put it away the week before, but again, no log to show who used it. Without internet, our selection and features are limited. Harbor Freight has a two camera recorder system for \$200. We will be purchasing a system soon, so we can identify who is using the expensive club equipment without following rules.
