


HOLIDAY LIGHTS RIDES ARE HERE!

JR. ENGINEER SCHOOL – MLS TRADITION



A staple of our weekly public rides has been Hank Gallo's Jr. Engineer School, giving youngsters a chance to operate a train and get excited about the ride-on train hobby. Hank is moving to a new request system. Interested families can now contact MLS to arrange specific times for the school.

I asked Hank to give some background on his outreach effort. Here's a few excerpts...

"It came about because our 1976 scratch built "Chessie System" switcher was difficult to drive for my children. The 5HP gas engine and centrifugal clutch were too touchy. We converted it to two electric bicycle motors, two 12-volt deep cycle batteries and electronic speed control. We built a custom joystick control with a speed limiter dial in the cab. A twist takes the top speed from 5 MPH to zero or anywhere in between. We began to take friends and their small children to the park and found they really felt special driving a train."

"Guidelines: We had to stay inside the yard limit (to comply with club rules about public runs). Top speed would be about 2.5 MPH. Dead man control (when you let go of the stick, the train stops). Cut-off switch (when I throw the cutoff the train won't move under power-in case of a derail or unruly child). I would walk next to the child at all times. Take time with each child to explain the horn signals and how to start & stop. I ask them to tell their passengers "All aboard" and off we go. "

"The riding car has two seats plus I have a 3-seat gondola. We load the train from youngest to oldest and as each engineer completes the run down and back on track 4, we give them a postcard with a photo of the train that states "Junior Engineer School Graduate". Then the next


oldest moves up to be engineer. You must keep the run time to a minute or two or the crowd can build up. I have an engineer log book next to the bench that I ask children of all ages to write their first name. Next to the book is a Junior Engineer School donation bucket."

"We get so much joy seeing a child (and parent) bubbling over with excitement that they can drive a train."

THINGS ARE HAPPENING



You may see changes on the ground at Adobe Western. Some of the concrete ties are setting next to the track where plastic ties have been inserted. In order to run some of the larger locomotives on the tighter curves, a slight bit of widening of the track gauge is needed, and therefore some modification of the bins for pouring concrete ties is necessary.

Please be patient this gets worked out. Also, there is talk of possibly using a larger ballast rock size. Out on Bobberg there's some experimenting with a slip-on type of rail joiner (as used up on Train Mountain), so lots of interesting developments for 2025. We'll keep you informed!
