## SAFETY AND SECURITY

Safety and Security is a priority for all our members and visiting guests, as it is our responsibility to maintain this safe & secure environment for everyone. A few topics to remember for everyone's safety:

-- When operating the electric powered transfer tables, prior to moving, visually ensure that the power charging

cord is unplugged. After moving, please set the hand brake to lock the wheels and return the direction lever to the neutral (vertical) position when not in use. Please plug in charging cord when finished using.

-- After using or moving the manual transfer table, please return it to the lead line and lower the transfer plate onto the lower lead line to lock the table from moving. This will keep the table from traveling during high winds that may cause it to forcibly hit the electric transfer table. We will be making signs that will be attached to the table.



-- When operating manual track switches, please do not step on the rod that moves the direction of the switch to lift the control arm. This can damage the rod and cause the switch to go out of adjustment. Ensure that the control arm is flush with the ground after selecting the direction to avoid a trip hazard.

-- In reference to security, please secure any personal property before leaving the club. When unlocking a club owned storage container or work shed, it is your responsibility to ensure that it is locked and secured. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated and benefits us all.

## **FIRE SAFETY**



With the horrific California fires on everyone's mind this year, we must remember that fire prevention and safety is very important for us here in the Arizona desert as well. Although the specific county fire ban restrictions may not be posted at the time we are running our trains, it is still very important to take every precaution to avoid starting a wildfire at the railroad park. Dry weed fuel is everywhere, and we have suffered damage in the past from fires at our park. When dry camping in the designated areas, please refrain from open wood campfires. Small contained BBQ pit fires are allowed if there is no brush nearby, and you have fire suppression gear on hand.

When doing trackwork or chores and repairs on equipment, remember that fires can be started by more sources than open flame. Sparks and hot bits can come from grinders, welders, and other equipment. Please also be careful parking your vehicles. The hot exhaust system under trucks and cars with cat converters can ignite dry brush.


